

Cauliflower Mushroom Poppers

1 head cauliflower, chopped60 whole baby Portabella mushrooms

1 cup nonfat plain yogurt ½ cup reduced fat shredded cheddar cheese 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese 3/4 cup crushed bran flakes

½ cup chopped red bell pepper

1/2 cup chopped green bell pepper

1 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon pepper

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder Paprika

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F.
Grease a 9-by-13-inch baking pan.
Steam the cauliflower by placing in a saucepan in ½-inch of boiling water, cover with lid and cook for 5 minutes. Drain. Place cooked cauliflower in a bowl and mash using a potato masher. Remove the stems and scoop out the caps of mushrooms. Chop stems for later use. Combine yogurt, cheddar cheese, Parmesan cheese, bran flakes, bell peppers, salt, pepper and garlic powder in a medium

bowl. **Stir** in cauliflower and ½ cup of the reserved chopped mushroom stems. **Stuff** the cauliflower mixture into the hollowed mushroom caps. **Sprinkle** with paprika. **Bake**, uncovered for 20 minutes.

Yield: 20 servings, 3 mushrooms per serving

Nutritional Analysis: 45 calories, 1.5 g fat, 1 g saturated fat, 5 mg cholesterol, 200 mg sodium, 5 g carbohydrate, 1 g sugars, 4 g protein.

Kentucky Cauliflower

SEASON: June, September,
October and early November.
NUTRITION FACTS: Cauliflower is
low in calories, with only 25 calories
per half cup serving. It is very
low in sodium and has no fat or
cholesterol. A serving provides 10
percent of the Daily Recommended
Value of folate, 8 percent of
dietary fiber and potassium and
100 percent of the recommended
amount of vitamin C.

SELECTION: Heads should be creamy white in color, firm and heavy. Look for tight, unblemished curds and fresh looking leaves and stalk.

STORAGE: Cauliflower may be stored for up to one week in a plastic bag in the refrigerator. Keep it dry and do not wash it until

ready to use. Any brownish colored bruises may be trimmed away before cooking.

PREPARATION: Cauliflower is best eaten raw or cooked barely tender and snowy white. It can be delicious, or it can be strong, mushy and beige in color if cooked for too long. Remove green stalks. Wash and soak, in cold salted water for 30 minutes. Leave the head whole, or break into florets. Cook covered in water until tender.

PRESERVING:

Freezing: Break flowerets into pieces about 1 inch across. Wash and blanch 3 minutes in boiling water, chill and drain. Label and date the package. Freeze immediately. Use all frozen produce within a year.

4-H Youth Development Code of

CONDUCT FORM (NOT FOR RESIDENTIAL CAMPS)

All 4-H members and family/friends associated with 4-H members must respect the individual rights, safety and property of others and adhere to this Code of Conduct. A 4-H member may be prohibited from participating in a specific event/program if the participation by the individual poses a derger to the 4-H member and/or others. The following guidelines are designed to make all 4-H events safe, meaningful, and satisfying to youth and others attending.

WHILE ATTENDING ALL 4-H MEETINGS, PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS:

- 1. Each 4-H participant is expected to attend all planned sessions, workshops, field trips, and meetings of the event, and to be in appropriate attire. Dress codes will be specific to individual events. Delegation chaperones and/or volunteers are responsible for ensuring that members participate in all aspects of the planned program activities.
- The possession and use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, vape juice and/or devices, and/or drugs (except for medications prescribed to the participant by a licensed physician) are prohibited. Delegation chaperones and/or volunteers shall limit us e of tobacco products to designated areas
- 3. Possession officearms not for educational use is prohibited.
- 4. Setting off fire alarms and tampering with fire extinguishing and other emergency equipment are prohibited.
- 5. Gambling of any type is prohibited.
- 6. Respect toward others and facilities shall be demonstrated. Bullying, harassment of others or destruction of property shall not be tolerated. Bullying and harassment can include the use of social media.
- 7. Obscene, discriminatory and/or inappropriate language, roughhousing, and insubordination are prohibited at all times.
- 8. Display of overly affectionate or inappropriate attention between participants is prohibited.
- 9. Technological equipment (including but not limited to cell phones, laptops or mp3 players) shall not interfere with the program and may not be allowed in certain situations.
- 10. All dothings hall be neat, dean, and acceptable in repair and appearance and shall be worn within the bounds of decency and good taste as appropriate for 4H events. Articles of clothing which display profanity, products, or slogars which promote tobacco, alcohol, drugs, sex or are in any other way distracting, are prohibited. Each county may adopt additional Code of Conduct guidelines.

WHILE ATTENDING OVERNIGHT CONFERENCES, CAMPS, AND EVENTS, THE FOLLOWING WILL ALSO APPLY:

- 1 All participants are to be in their assigned area at curfew and comply with quiet hours, lights out, and other rules of the event.
- 2. No member or volunteer may leave the grounds without the permission of the conference director or adult in charge. An adult is hall accompany a 4-H member any time they leave the grounds. Adults shall notify another adult in the delegation before leaving the grounds.
- At overnight events, only conference participants may be in sleeping areas. Lounges or common areas may be used only for working committees and social activities.
- 4. Room service such as phone calls, food, laundry, or others shall not be permitted without chaperone permission.

Any violations of this Code of Conduct shall be reported promotive to the adult in charge of the delegation/program and to the person in charge of the event. The person in charge of the event shall have the final responsibility for disciplinary action. Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct by 4-H'ers and family/friends associated with the 4-Hi participant may result in penalty including, but not ilimited to, the following:

- Sent home from the activity or event at his/her own expense
- Barred from participation from future 4-H events
- Assess ed the cost of damages for destruction of property

They may also practice the skill of record keeping by keeping track of their 4-H achievements throughout the program year and putting together a "4-H Journal."

What additional benefits are there? If your child completes a project, presents a demonstration or gives a speech, and turns in a journal they will earn a plaque and a County Achievement Award.

Project Books will be distributed at a club meeting.
