
April 16th at 11:00am at the Extension Office. They will meet the 3rd Tuesday of the month.



Requirements

- Applicants must be 4-H Age of 14-18 as of the current year
- Be enrolled in and an active member of their County 4-H Program
- Submit application to rebecca.hayes@uky.edu by 4:00pm on April 12, 2024
- other requirements depending on the board chosen

Science, Engineering, and Technology Board (SET):

These individuals should have an interest in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics as well as the passion to share that interest with others. Board members will learn how to develop their skills in teaching and encouraging others while having fun and learning more about themselves. The expectation for Board members is to approach each new project with innovation, creativity, and critical thinking to make it the best it can be for everyone involved. The yearly cost is \$250.

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Kentucky 4-H State Leadership Boards

Fashion Leadership Board (FLB):

The Kentucky 4-H Fashion Leadership Board will consist of individuals who have an interest in Fashion, Textiles, and Sewing as well as the passion to share that interest with others. Board members will learn how to develop their skills in teaching and encouraging others while having fun and learning more about themselves. The expectation for Board members is to approach each new project with innovation, creativity and critical thinking in order to make it the best it can be for everyone involved. The yearly cost is \$550.

State Teen Council (STC):

It is the spirit of this process that those selected will show exemplary leadership and teamwork skills, as well as having a strong commitment to 4-H and the State Teen Council. Selected representatives are elected to a two year term SUBJECT to 4-H eligibility. Please review the 4-H age policy to determine your eligibility. Your membership as some selected representative ends during the program year in which you age out of 4-H. The yearly cost is \$500.

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DIY Popcorn Bar

Servings: 7 Serving Size: 2 cups





Ingredients:

- · 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- ½ cup popcorn kernels
- · 2 tablespoons melted butter
- · Dash of salt

Directions:

- 1. Preheat a large (at least 14 cups) nonstick pot with a tight-fitting lid over medium-high heat for two minutes. Open the lid, and add a few drops of water to the pot. If they immediately sizzle, reduce the heat to slightly above low.
- 2. Add the oil and popcorn kernels, and immediately replace the lid.
- 3. Gently shake the pot every few seconds. The popcorn kernels will start popping within a few minutes. Continue to gently shake the pot every few seconds while the popcorn pops.
- 4. The popcorn is done when at least three seconds lapse between kernel pops.
- 5. Immediately remove the pot from the heat, pour the melted butter over the popcorn and sprinkle the salt on top. Toss to coat.
- 6. Divide hot popcorn into individual cups or bags and provide a variety of flavorings to create a unique flavor.
- 7. For fun, set up a flavor station using some of the ideas below. Start with a sprinkle or drizzle of flavoring, adding more until the desired taste is achieved.

Notes

Flavor Station Ideas

- · Chili powder
- · Raisins or other dried fruit
- · Parmesan cheese
- Pizza (Mix 1/2 cup dried parmesan 1 teaspoon garlic powder and 1 teaspoon dried oregano)
- Parmesan cheese and garlic (Mix 1/2 cup grated parmesan with 1 teaspoon garlic)
- Cinnamon and sugar (Mix 2 tablespoons of sugar and 2 tablespoons cinnamon)
- · Cool ranch (Mix 2 tablespoons powdered buttermilk, 2 tablespoons black pepper and 2 teaspoons dried dill weed)
- Barbeque (Mix 1 tablespoon 1 tablespoon cumin, 1 tablespoon paprika, 1 tablespoon garlic, 1 tablespoon chili powder and 1 tablespoon barbecue sauce)
- Peanut butter (Heat 1/4 cup honey with ½ cup peanut butter and ½ teaspoon each vanilla extract)
- Taco (Mix 1 tablespoon chili powder, 1 teaspoon ground cumin, 1 teaspoon garlic powder, 1 teaspoon paprika, 1/2 teaspoon oregano, 1/2 teaspoon onion powder, 1/4 teaspoon black pepper)
- Dill Pickle (Mix 2 teaspoons ground coriander, 2 teaspoons dried dill, 1/2 teaspoon ground mustard, 1/2 teaspoons garlic powder, 1/2 teaspoon onion powder and 1/2 teaspoon celery seed)

***A hot air popper can also be used to pop popcorn. After popping popcorn according to appliance directions, begin at step 5 to create flavored popcorn.
