

Every summer, youth from around the state gather at 4-H Camp locations for 5 days loaded with numerous opportunities. Kentucky 4-H Summer Camp is an American Camp Association Accredited camp geared toward youth that are 9-14 years of age who would enjoy spending a week outdoors, learning new skills, and making new friends. Carter County youth will attend camp with the youth from Bath, Boyd, Carroll, Gallatin, and Greenup Counties. They will take 4 classes of their choosing and enjoy afternoon and evening activities with the youth in their cabins and the whole camp. These activities include free swim, messy games, carnival, relay games, and much more!

We also look to take anyone 16 and older to serve in counselor roles. This means that older siblings, cousins, neighbors, guardians, parents, and anyone looking to volunteer can attend camp. (Persons 18 and older must pass a detailed background check.) These volunteers will get to help with classes, see that the youth are having safe fun, and you can get to spend quality time with your child and their friends.

# PLAN. EAT. MOVE.

## Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- ¼ cup onion, finely chopped
- 2 (15.8 ounce) cans of great northern beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 (14.5 ounce) can diced tomatoes with basil, garlic and oregano
- 1 (14 ounce) can low-sodium vegetable or chicken broth
- 4 cups kale, torn into small pieces
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

### Directions:

- 1. In a medium saucepan, heat oil over medium heat and sauté garlic and onion for 3 minutes or until onion is tender.
- 2. Add beans, tomatoes and broth to saucepan. Stir and simmer for 5 minutes. Add kale and cook until tender, for about 2 minutes.
- 3. Mix in lemon juice and Parmesan cheese just before serving. Optional, garnish with finely chopped fresh basil or dried basil.

### Notes

Cooked, dried beans may be substituted for canned beans. Using prepared dry beans in place of canned will reduce sodium in this dish. If you can't find diced tomatoes with basil, garlic and oregano, use regular diced tomatoes and add dried versions of these seasonings.
